#### Romans 16:1-5a NIV

I commend to you our sister **Phoebe**, a deacon, of the church in Cenchreae. <sup>2</sup> I ask you to receive her in the Lord in a way worthy of his people and to give her any help she may need from you, for she has been the benefactor of many people, including me.

<sup>3</sup> Greet **Priscilla and Aquila**, my co-workers in Christ Jesus. <sup>4</sup> They risked their lives for me. Not only I but all the churches of the Gentiles are grateful to them.

<sup>5</sup> Greet also the church that meets at their house.

Greet my dear friend Epenetus, who was the first convert to Christ in the province of Asia. <sup>6</sup> Greet Mary, who worked very hard for you. <sup>7</sup> Greet Andronicus and Junia, my fellow Jews who have been in prison with me. They are outstanding among the apostles, and they were in Christ before I was. <sup>8</sup> Greet Ampliatus, my dear friend in the Lord. <sup>9</sup> Greet Urbanus, our co-worker in Christ, and my dear friend Stachys. <sup>10</sup> Greet Apelles, whose fidelity to Christ has stood the test. Greet those who belong to the household of Aristobulus. <sup>11</sup> Greet Herodion, my fellow Jew. Greet those in the household of Narcissus who are in the Lord. <sup>12</sup> Greet Tryphena and Tryphosa, those women who work hard in the Lord. Greet my dear friend Persis, another woman who has worked very hard in the Lord. <sup>13</sup> Greet Rufus, chosen in the Lord, and his mother, who has been a mother to me, too. <sup>14</sup> Greet Asyncritus, Phlegon, Hermes, Patrobas, Hermas and the other brothers and sisters with them. <sup>15</sup> Greet Philologus, Julia, Nereus and his sister, and Olympas and all the Lord's people who are with them. <sup>16</sup> Greet one another with a holy kiss. All the churches of Christ send greetings.

HEAD COVERINGS

#### Luke 8:1-3 NIV

After this, Jesus traveled about from one town and village to another, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom of God. The Twelve were with him, <sup>2</sup> and also some women who had been cured of evil spirits and diseases: **Mary** (called Magdalene) from whom seven demons had come out; <sup>3</sup> **Joanna** the wife of Chuza, the manager of Herod's household; **Susanna**; and **many others**. These women were helping to support them out of their own means.

HEAD COVERINGS

### Luke 24:1-3, 9-11 NIV

On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, **the women** took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. <sup>2</sup> They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, <sup>3</sup> but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus...<sup>9</sup> When they came back from the tomb, they told all these things to the Eleven and to all the others. <sup>10</sup> It was **Mary Magdalene**, **Joanna**, **Mary** the mother of James, and **the others** with them who told this to the apostles. <sup>11</sup> But they did not believe the women, because their words seemed to them like nonsense.

### 1 Corinthians 11:4-7a, 13-14 NIV

Every **man** who prays or prophesies with his head covered dishonors his head. <sup>5</sup> But every **woman** who prays or prophesies with her head uncovered dishonors her head—it is the same as having her head shaved. <sup>6</sup> For if a **woman** does not cover her head, she might as well have her hair cut off; but if it is a disgrace for a woman to have her hair cut off or her head shaved, then she should cover her head. <sup>7</sup> A **man** ought not to cover his head...

<sup>13</sup> Judge for yourselves: Is it proper for a **woman** to pray to God with her head uncovered? <sup>14</sup> Does not the very nature of things teach you that if a **man** has long hair, it is a disgrace to him...

### 1 Corinthians 11:3 NIV

But I want you to realize that the head of every man is Christ, and the head of the woman is man, and the head of Christ is God.
